Letter from the Board

Toward the end of each year the Willow Creek III Budget Committee has the task of recommending a budget that it believes will meet our community needs for the following year.

The Budget Committee was led this year by Treasurer, Fred Kremer, along with former Treasurer, Martin Garrity, and committee members Ted Miller, Jeff Stevens, Bob Bartlett and Bob Correll. The committee also thanks Jerry Grant for providing his budgeting expertise.

The Willow Creek III budget is made up of five funds. Those are: the General Operating Fund, the General Reserve Fund, the Townhome Operating Fund, the Townhome Reserve Fund and the Townhome Water Fund. Townhome dues are applied to all five funds while single-family home dues are applied to the General Operating and General Reserve Funds.

The Budget Committee met in December. After looking at past budgets and projecting future needs, the committee recommended to the board of directors a 2017 budget of \$568,000. That budget was approved at the December 8 board meeting and takes effect **February 1**.

Based on the 2017 budget, single-family home dues will increase \$2 to \$92. This is the first increase in single-family home dues since 2013. Townhome dues will be \$135. That is a \$10 decrease. Townhome dues faced two increases in 2016. The second, which was in mid-summer, was to make up for greater-than-normal snow removal costs from last winter.

Coming up with final budget numbers is always a balancing act. A cold, snowy winter can be tough on the budget, while a wet summer can be budget friendly because it lessens the need to water our greenbelts. Storm damage during the year or unexpected repairs to community property are also among the many variables that can impact the budget projections.

The committee and board have worked to provide what they believe is a budget that is financially prudent and will meet community needs in 2017.

OTHER NEWS

- At the December 8 board meeting, Mike De Rosayro was appointed to fill a vacancy on the seven-member board. He will complete the two years that remain on the three-year term. Welcome to the board Mike!

Water your trees in winter!

Don't leave your trees without water. If you want healthy trees in the spring and summer, it's important to take care of them throughout the year, and that includes watering them at least once a month. Here's the best way to do that:

- WATER THE ROOT ZONE: Most roots are within the top 12 inches of soil. Apply water evenly to the entire critical root zone, from the tree trunk to beneath the tips of the branches.
- WATER SLOWLY: Apply water slowly so it moistens the soil about 12 inches deep.
- USE MULCH: Apply three to four inches of organic mulch on top of the critical root zone. Leave a small space between the mulch and the tree trunk to prevent insects from getting to the bark and to prevent rotting. Mulch may include natural materials such as wood chips, bark and leaves or evergreen needles.



How Emergency Alerts Work

When the county issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern, messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices (land line, mobile, e-mail, instant messaging, text messaging, PDA, alpha or numeric pager, etc.) that you have registered in the system. The system will continue trying to contact you on these devices until it receives a confirmation from you that the message has been received.

Please note that this system will not be used for weather alerts because the timeliness or accuracy of such alerts cannot be guaranteed. There are a variety of other media outlets (TV and radio stations, and weather-related Web sites and alerts) that can provide this service in a more timely manner.

How to sign up for Emergency Alerts

Residents and businesses with land line phones are already listed in Arapahoe County's 9-1-1 database, and are therefore automatically included in the notification system. You may sign up to register additional mobile devices on the website www.co.arapahoe.co.us. Your information will be kept strictly confidential.






