Congratulations to Betsy Alexander and Bob Bartlett who were elected to the Willow Creek 3 Board of Directors during the annual HOA meeting. This is Betsy's first term in office. She garnered the most votes — 109. Bob, who completed two years following the vacancy left by Buzz Van Welden, finished with 79 votes. Both were elected to serve three-year terms. The third candidate, Ben Sender, received 60 votes. A total of 248 homeowners voted either in person or by proxy out of 515 homeowners. That's a 48 percent turnout.

The designation "Eagle Scout" was founded over one hundred years ago. Only four percent of Boy Scouts are granted this rank after a lengthy review process.

Board member Martin Garrity volunteered to work with Rody to oversee the project. Once completed the fitness station will feature facilities for chin-up and dip exercises. The station will have signage that states "Use at your own risk" and directions about proper use of the station.







Willow Creek 3 Annual Meeting: October 11, 2018

Call to Order: President, Jay Weber called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Establish Quorum: Quorum needed to conduct the meeting is 10% or 52 owners and or proxies. There were a total of 145 owners and or proxies counted to establish quorum.

Proof of Notice of Meeting: The Certificate of Mailing executed August 22, 2018 was presented as Proof of Notice for the candidate application mailing and the Certificate of Mailing executed September 21, 2018 was presented as Proof of Notice for the Annual Meeting Notice.

Purpose of Meeting: The purpose of the meeting is to elect two (2) members to the Board of Directors.

Approval of October 12, 2017 Annual Meeting Minutes: The 2017 Annual Meeting minutes were submitted to the Homeowners for review and approval.

Motion to approve the October 12, 2017 Annual Meeting minutes as written was made Martin Garrity and seconded by Bob Bartlett. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Review: Fred Kremer, Treasurer, presented a recap of the 2018 financials and the State of the Association. Power point presentation included in these minutes. A motion to close the nominations was made and seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

The nominees addressed the membership and were given a few minutes to introduce themselves and take questions from the membership.

Open Forum:

He has asked the WC3 Board to be a beneficiary of project. Rody submitted a map and schematics for the fitness station. Martin Garrity volunteered to be point of contact for this project.

Motion to approve fitness station was made by Laura Ream and seconded by Martin Garrity. Caveat: Contact insurance agent regarding liability of this fitness station. Motion passed unanimously.

- Townhome owner reported the alley way paved on August 1st has not compacted. When will they be out to repair cracks and correct deficiencies?
- Homeowner thanked outgoing Board members for their service on behalf of the community.
- Homeowner asked when the repairs to the tennis courts are going to be made. Who are the people playing who are not Willow Creek 3 homeowners. It was explained that these are the tennis leagues that are playing.

New Business: There was no new business presented at meeting.

Results of the Election: It was announced that Bob Bartlett and Betsy Alexander were elected to the Board of Directors.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 7:20 p.m.

You will then be emailed the *Request to Paint Form* and it will indicate which colors are not available to you. (Your neighbors' exterior home colors can impact your options.)

You can then either borrow the approved paint color book from the paint coordinator or view the one available at our local Sherwin-Williams store (See below for store details.) When you have made your choice, complete online the *Request to Paint Form* sent to you by the coordinator. The paint coordinator will then let you know if your choice(s) have been approved.

WILLOW CREEK ELEMENTARY NAMED NATIONAL BLUE RIBBON SCHOOL: For the third time in 20 years, Willow Creek Elementary has been named a National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. Willow Creek, which also earned Blue Ribbon recognition in 1999 and 2006, is one of five schools in Colorado and 349 schools nationwide to be honored this year. It is one of eight CCSD schools that have earned National Blue Ribbon School honors for outstanding academic achievement or notable improvements in closing achievement gaps.

PROGRESS REPORT ON BOND PROJECTS: The Cherry Creek School District has come a long way since the end of the 2017-18 school year. That's thanks in large part to projects made possible by funds from the 2016 bond and budget election, which have been steadily coming to fruition across the district over the past five months. Those include opening of Infinity Middle School in August and Altitude Elementary in late October, completion of the first 15 Innovation Spaces going in at all elementary and middle schools, and progress on the Cherry Creek Innovation Campus, which will open in August, 2019.

Safety on Train Platforms - Five Things to Know Before You Go

RTD employees work daily to promote safety in all of our services and facilities. Passengers can also play an important safety role by being aware of their surroundings, especially on trains and train platforms. These five key safety tips will help you stay safe around buses and trains:

- 1. Remember that light rail trains are quiet. It is best to avoid distractions, such as wearing headphones or looking at your cell phone while on the platform.
- 2. Stay alert. Trains can come from either direction at any time. Pay attention to warning signs and signals around station platforms.
- 3. Never run to catch a moving train or bus. Plan ahead and give yourself plenty of time to make your train.
- 4. While waiting for a train, stand at least three feet away from the platform edge. Trains are wider than the tracks, so be sure to stay behind the yellow raised markings until it is time to board the train.
- 5. Play it safe on train platforms. Use the marked crossings and look both ways when crossing the tracks.


