Letter from the Board

The Board of Directors would like to extend a sincere thank you to the Willow Creek Tennis Club whose members spent Saturday morning November 9th, preparing the courts for winter by rolling up the wind screens. Your efforts are greatly appreciated by all!

Thanks to due diligence on the part of your board homeowners will greet 2020 without a monthly dues increase!

This will be the third year that dues have remained the same (\$102 for single-family homes and \$140 for town homes) even though 2020 through 2023 are expected to present some challenges, as noted during last month's annual budget presentation. Chief among them is replacing some or all of the tennis courts. Although no decision has been made, the board is planning for the future.

The board was able to reduce expenses in the Operating Fund by \$7 so it moved this amount to the General Reserve Fund, increasing the monthly contribution to \$28 from \$21. Seven dollars may not seem like much but when you take that amount times 515 homeowners over 12 months it becomes sizable — \$43,260!

A little history. The General Reserve Fund is one of five funds that make up the annual HOA budget. It is designed to help cover some of the replacement costs for big ticket items, such as the clubhouse, tennis courts, swimming pool.

All households pay into this fund as well as into the Operating Fund. The other funds — Townhome Water, Townhome Reserve and Townhome Operating — are covered exclusively by townhome owners. Hence the difference in monthly dues: 102 for single-family homes and 140 for town homes.

The goal for increasing the monthly contribution is to help build cash reserves for upcoming capital projects. With upcoming capital expenditures — specifically how the aging tennis courts are addressed — the BOD is working to keep our Reserve at appropriate funding level.

One budget item that's hard to pin down every year is the cost of snow removal.

Weather records show over the past 10 years that the greater Denver area has been averaging just over 48 inches annually. To some that paints a picture that Mother Nature is predictable. Not so. Remember March of 2003; We got more than four feet of snow in two days!

With that in mind, your board is trying to take a proactive approach to controlling costs. One step is to enforce single-family homeowners to clear their sidewalks from property line to property line. That's always been the case but in the past snow removal companies have cleared homeowners sidewalks (corner lots in particular).

That may change at the December board meeting when the directors will vote on a proposed update to the boundary lines for snow removal. Stay tuned.

The Architectural Committee is filing Liens.

No one wants a lien against their home. However, the Architectural Control Committee is starting to lien homeowners that fail to comply with ACC notices and generate substantial fines. Our community is covenant controlled and 95% of us comply with ACC notices that keep our community attractive and desirable. There are only a few that habitually ignore notices to paint, remove a dead tree, water the yard, fix a fence, store garbage cans properly and other infractions. Remember that the ACC will work with homeowners that are having difficulties meeting deadlines, illness and financial hardships can affect us all. Usually this involves an extension to complete the work. However, the homeowner must contact us through the management company as soon as it is apparent that a deadline will be missed or if there is a question about the notice. Waiting a six month to a year and generating \$500 plus in fines in not advisable. The goal of the ACC is to maintain a community as envisioned by the Writer Corporation when originally designed.

Snow Removal in Willow Creek

In case you are wondering when our Willow Creek 3 residential streets qualify for city snowplowing following a winter snow storm, here's the scoop: The city prioritizes its streets into Priority 1, Priority 2 and Priority 3. Our WC3 streets are considered Priority 3. According to the city's website, "Priority 3 streets are maintained only when authorized by the City Manager or his designee. The City Manager will consider the following guidelines in determining when to authorize Priority 3 snow route plowing: Forecasted street snow accumulation is six (6) or more inches; Forecasted temperatures are below freezing for an extended period after the storm; Forecasted additional snow events within the next 24-48 hours." Although city residents are not required to shovel their residential sidewalks, the city "strongly encourages citizens to remove snow from the sidewalks adjoining their property within 24 hours after a snowstorm ends.

WIIIOW Greek Pets

Dogs must be leashed when they are out and about in our community. Both the city and our HOA require it. City of Centennial Animal Control patrols Willow Creek and will issue warnings and tickets to offenders. There have been serious incidents in the past where unleashed dogs have injured other pets and/or caused residents to be concerned for their safety.



Don't forget to clean up after your pet when dog walking. The city of Centennial (municipal code 7-7-320) as well as Willow Creek 3 policies, require that pet owners remove and dispose of pet waste on any property other than that of the owner or keeper. In other words, when you are out and about with your dog, don't leave a mess. City fines start at \$50 and can include a Municipal Court appearance. And if you see someone not following the rules, please let them know. Also, both Willow Creek 3 and the city require that dogs be leashed and under control when out in the community.

The Jones District Regulating Plan Approved

At its Monday, November 18 meeting, the Centennial City Council approved the Regulating Plan for The Jones District. The Jones District is an office, residential and retail development proposed to be built on 36 acres of vacant land just east of Willow Creek between the Ikea store and the Dry Creek light rail station. A Regulating Plan determines the heights of buildings, the number of residential units, configuration of the streets and other details. Brue-Baukol Capital Partners is the developer.

The OK for construction to start on the project has not yet met with the city's final approval but, in football terms, it's within five yards of scoring a touchdown. Approval of a Site Plan by the council is still needed for construction to begin. A Site Plan includes the drawings that the developer or contractor intends to use for actual construction on the property.

Once approved, full construction and development of The Jones District is expected to take a decade or more.
