The policy on garbage can storage is very clear. They must be stored out of sight either behind the fence or in the garage. Specifically, the policy states, "Along side the house is unacceptable." And while it may be convenient for the home owner to store garbage cans next to the home, usually the garage, this is considered an eye-sore for the community. As the guidelines state, "Realtors hold open houses and show clients our neighborhood on the weekends, and we owe it to them and our fellow home owners to present Willow Creek III in a good light."

Is the Architectural Control Committee omnipresent? Obviously, an impossibility, we can't catch every infraction of the ACC guidelines and covenants. Perhaps you notice an item that ranges from lawn maintenance to dead tree removal to peeling paint. If you see an issue that seems ACC related, send an e-mail to HG Management at support@hgmanage. com and the ACC will respond. The ACC has definite procedures for handling all types of covenant breeches. The time frame to rectify a situation may seem prolonged; however, the ACC has a very high compliance rate.

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

The WCIII HOA is receiving a number of complaints re: incidents at the pool (adult confrontations, children misbehaving, folks not adhering to social distancing or not wearing masks, young children being dropped off without supervision).

This puts both the HOA and the lifeguards in a life-safety & health predicament as the job of the lifeguards is to ensure the safety of the residents, not to break up incidents or babysit.

Effective immediately, the following regulations are in place:

- No guests allowed. Only WCIII residents are permitted-we need to be able to accommodate our own residents as a priority with the current limit of 50 individuals.
- You must have a key card to be allowed to enter.
- All children under the age of 11 MUST be accompanied by a guardian at all times.
- Poor behavior by residents both young and old will not be tolerated. Family pool privileges will be revoked indefinitely, and lifeguards have the authority to call the sheriff's office if warranted.
- The pool will close if social distancing and masks set forth by the CDPHE guidelines are not followed.

Toll rates for the new C-470 Express Lanes

- General purpose lanes will always be free. Tolls apply only to Express Lanes.
- Tolls will range from 65¢ to \$3.60 per toll point with an ExpressToll pass, depending on the time of day.
- When tolling begins in Aug., drivers will be charged depending on how far they travel in the C-470 Express Lanes.
- C-470 Express Lanes are free for all motorcycles, with no pass required.
- Free carpooling is not available on these lanes.
- Get a Pass! ExpressToll saves money each time, at least 40% savings compared to the pricing without a pass. Go to www.expresstoll.com/ Home to get a pass. ExpressToll passes are used on all Express Lane & tolling facilities in Colorado. Please note, on C-470, the Switchable HOV Transponder will not provide the HOV discount, even if the slider is in HOV mode.
- WB travelers: There are 3 WB toll points from I-25/E-470 to University, from University to Santa Fe, & from Santa Fe to Wadsworth.
- EB travelers: There are 2 EB toll points from Wadsworth to Broadway and from Broadway to I-25/E-470.
- Do not cross the solid white lines; enter and exit at the designated entrances and exits marked with a dashed white line.

How will tolls be collected? Tolls will be collected electronically. It's best to have an ExpressToll pass that is used on all toll facilities in Colorado. If you plan to carpool on other Express Lanes, where free carpooling is allowed, e.g., I-25 or US 36 Express Lanes, you should get an ExpressToll pass that switches to the HOV mode. That way you can ride in the Express Lanes for free as long as there are 3 or more people in the vehicle. Note that the C-470 Express Lanes will not have a free HOV option. An ExpressToll pass is the most cost-effective way to pay tolls. For those Express Lane users who do not have an ExpressToll pass, cameras will read their license plate, and they will be billed for tolls. License plate tolling could be up to 40% higher due to administrative costs of processing billing.

About the High Performance Transportation Enterprise (HPTE): The HPTE operates as a government-owned, independent business within CDOT. It searches for innovative ways to finance projects to help Colorado fulfill its commitment to increase travel choices through options that include Express Lanes, transit, biking, walking and carpooling.

West Fork Disc Golf Course is Open: After several months of construction, the final touches have been completed at West Fork Disc Golf Course. The new course is located at 9095 S. Broadway in Highlands Ranch and is a partnership between the Highlands Ranch Metro District and South Suburban.

The 18-hole public course, designed by John Bird and Birdie Disc Golf LLC, features a mix of open shots and more technical areas. It offers something both for recreational players and those with more experience. It is free for drop-in use.

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
