## **Letter from the Board**

It's official: For the first time in 15 months your board of directors will be meeting in person!

We'll get together at 6 pm as usual for June 10th meeting but with one caveat: we will limit attendance to board members and representatives from HG management only. This arrangement is just a precaution. Now that in-person restrictions due to the Covid outbreak have been lifted, we are planning to open future meetings to homeowners starting in July. In the meantime, we encourage you to tune via Zoom.

As for the clubhouse opening, we are taking a closer look at how to keep the facility safer for those who use it. Most likely we will require homeowners who rent the clubhouse to pay a cleaning fee to deep clean the facility. That most likely will mean an increase in the rental fee. Plus renters will have to sign a waiver relieving the community and the board of any liability should those attending become infected with the virus. More later.

We are getting closer to picking a contractor to reconfigure the five tennis courts. Sport Courts of the Rockies, Altitude Athletic Surfaces and Renner Sports Surfaces submitted bids to replace the courts with post-tension concrete. Betsy Alexander, who oversees the Grounds and Amenities Committee that's reviewing the bids, says three areas the group is focusing on are references, concrete and SOV (Statement of Values). SOV is a term contractors use to breakdown the costs for different parts of a project. In this case the committee determines the the payment value for each segment and can use that information to negotiate with the selected contractor.

The board has approved an addendum to the 2009 Memo of Understanding (MOU) with the Willow Creek Tennis Club. Essentially it limits the club's use of the WC3 tennis courts to two for league play. The board also voted to not renew the tennis pro contract for lessons.

If you receive a notice to trim or remove a tree and that tree is in your neighbor's yard, just send an e-mail to Blair Laing at the WC III management company. Her email address is blaing@hgmanage. com. The ACC will then correct the issue.

#### Painting a single-family home?


Before you paint, be sure to e-mail the paint coordinator at willowcreek3paint@gmail.com. All you need to do is send an e-mail saying you want to paint and you will receive painting instructions. Paint colors for the single-family homes must be chosen from an approved palette of colors. Painting a home an existing color is often not acceptable as the spectrum of colors has changed over the years. The ACC works with paint professionals so that the homes in Willow Creek III are current with the prevailing trends. The ACC believes that this enhances the value of homes in Willow Creek.

#### Painting a town home?

Remember that town home owners must submit an ACC request when painting their home. This is a formality to ensure that the correct paint and shade of paint is used.

#### Architectural Control Committee Meeting time.

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) meets on the first Monday of the month at 7:00 on line. The link is available on our website, willowcreek3.com. Plans and requests that have been submitted over the previous 30 days to the management company are evaluated according to Willow Creek III guidelines and covenants. It is a good idea to plan ahead since approval for anything other than basic requests requires discussion by the ACC committee.

### Centennial Resumes Passport Operations

Passport operations have resumed at the City of Centennial's Civic Center, located at 13133 E. Arapahoe Road. Passport services are available Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. MST, by appointment only.

The City is accepting two applicants per 30-minute appointment block to accommodate facility cleaning between appointments. The City cannot make any exceptions to this rule. Book multiple appointment times as necessary. Additionally, the City's passport photo service remains unavailable at this time. Please bring your pictures to your appointment. For persons arriving at appointments without pictures in hand, the City will need to reschedule.

There is a high demand for passports, and appointments are limited. Please check back weekly as appointment availability may open up. If the City cannot accommodate your passport scheduling needs, you can find more information and other facilities offering passport appointments at travel.state.gov. You can visit the City's website for more information regarding appointments and required documentation at centennialco.gov/Passport.



## **April 15, 2021 | Via Teleconference Meeting | MINUTES**



#### I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

The Willow Creek Homeowners Association No. 3 Board of Directors Meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m. Board members attending were Aiden O'Shea, Jerry Grant, Bob Bartlett, Fred Kremer, Betsy Alexander, MaryBeth Doerr, and Bryan Zach. Also attending was Sabrina Lopez, CMCA, AMS representing HG Management. The meeting was held via teleconference due to Covid-19 requirements.

#### II. HOMEOWNER FORUM

The owners present were allowed an opportunity to bring any items of discussion to the board.

#### **III. COMMITTEE & OFFICER REPORTS**

- A. Landscape: JBK Reg Craigo reported slowly starting spring cleanup. Aeration and fertilization will take place mid-May.
