Letter from the Board

Please welcome the newest member of the Willow Creek III board of directors — Luke Adaline. Luke attended his first meeting in June when the board met in person for the first time in almost 15 months. Luke and his wife, Karlynn, moved to the neighborhood almost two and a half years ago when they were transferred from Pittsburgh where Luke worked in the financial and insurance industry. Why Willow Creek III? The real estate agent really tauted the neighborhood's amenities — specifically the swimming pool — and the award-winning Cherry Creek school system, Luke said. We are very happy that the couple chose our community!

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Speaking of changes, we have a new clubhouse manager. Sabrina Lopez of HG Management has agreed to take on the additional responsibilities of managing the clubhouse now that the former manager, Deanna Mumfrey, has decided to step down. Deanna has been running the show for better than 10 years. Thanks Deanna for your service!

Homeowners wishing to reserve the clubhouse are asked to contact Sabrina at 303-804-9800 or email her at Support@hgmanage.com at least two weeks in advance of the reservation date. Plans are to create a clubhouse calendar/reservation form on line to speed up the process.

As most are aware the rental fee has gone up — from \$35 to \$90 — to cover the extended cleaning costs during this pandemic year. Our hope is to reduce those costs if we can get past the covid virus. Fingers crossed.

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Your clubhouse will be getting a facelift in the very near future. The board has given AGS Construction the green light to repair the exterior building, iron fence and the pillar bricks. A closer inspection shows that many of the window sills and a good chunk of the siding need to be replaced and painted. Cost: \$18,943.58. The project may require that the pool be closed for a short period of time, or it may be completed while the facility is open.

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The Grounds and Amenities Committee is overseeing this project as well as the reconstruction of the tennis courts. The committee is still reviewing the bids from three companies (Sport Courts of the Rockies, Altitude Athletic Surfaces and Renner Sports Surfaces) and hopes to make the final selection next month. Stay tuned.

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We need your help! Vandals have damaged the scoring devices and benches at the tennis courts and we need to put a stop to it. Some trees died over the winter.

Now that the trees have leafed out, it is the home owners' responsibility to remove dead or mostly dead trees in their yards.

Watering the lawn.

Seems like every year the ACC has to remind a few single-family home owners to water their lawns. The Covenants are clear in that "The structures and ground of each lot shall be maintained in a neat and attractive manner." No one wants to see a parched homestead in the neighborhood. Please water the yard now that the weather is warm.

Yard Signs.

A reminder about notices placed on the mail kiosks; please remove them after a suitable time frame, about 7 days. And if you observe a notice that has been in place for an extended period of time, recycle it. Also, commercial signs are prohibited in yards, no roofing signs, no aeration signs, etc.

Disagree with an ACC notice?

Remember that if you feel an ACC notice is incorrect or would like more time to correct an issue, talk to the ACC. The ACC meets the first Monday of the month in the clubhouse at 7:00 P.M. Or send an e-mail to Darby Fontaine at dfontaine@hgmanage.com asking for an extension.

The clubhouse key must be returned no later than midnight the day of your event.

You are required to clean the clubhouse after use and take away all trash. No dumpster is available. A broom, mop, vacuum, garbage bags and cleaning supplies are provided. The clubhouse will be inspected after use and your deposit could be withheld.

You can decorate the clubhouse for your event as long as all decorations are removed, no marks are left, no damage is done and the clubhouse is left clean.

You may prepare food or have food catered. Alcohol is allowed as long as all laws are followed, it is kept within the clubhouse and it is not sold. The pool and tennis courts are not included in the rental.

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

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

"Our EV initiatives will not only benefit EV drivers, but all customers and the state, by reducing carbon emissions and delivering cleaner air for everyone.
