Letter from the Board

Renner Sports Services has been awarded the contract to replace our aging tennis courts.

The Littleton-based company is expected to start construction in October with a completion date set for mid-November — weather permitting. The \$358,864 contract is higher than the proposed \$350,000 amount announced in September, but that's not a surprise given the hike in construction costs/materials tied to the covid pandemic. The good news is that we have enough money in our reserve fund to cover the cost!

Your board picked Renner over Altitude Athletic Surfaces and Sport Courts of the Rockies based on the company's experience. The contract for the post-tension concrete work includes building five courts — two dedicated tennis courts, two shared courts for pickle ball and tennis, and a fifth court designed for multiple uses (ie basketball, soccer, shuffle board, hop-scotch, four square).

For those who don't know, the annual HOA meeting will be held on Thursday, Oct. 14, beginning at 6 p.m. at the clubhouse. It will be a relatively short meeting with no business discussion. Instead, homeowners will have an opportunity to hear our auditor review the financial status of our community, then elect two board members to fill the seats vacated by Betsy Alexander and Luke Adaline, whose terms have expired. The new board will then select officers for a one-year term.

Looking ahead, most likely the new board will continue the mission put into place by the outgoing administration. Namely, maintaining and — in some cases — upgrading our neighborhood. For example the clubhouse is scheduled to get a fresh coat of paint along with new exterior lighting and updated brick pillars that connect to the iron fencing surrounding the pool.

Next up are the asphalt walks along the greenbelts and townhome alleyways. More to come.

As mentioned in last month's letter, the board is looking at bids from Waste Management and Waste Connections. The decision will be sent to the community via an email blast and posted on the Willow Creek 3 website sometime in October.

October 2021 ACC Corner

Time has expired on many of the Architectural Control Committee's requests to paint or remove dead trees or water grass or to correct other deficiencies. When a reasonable time frame has elapsed, the ACC is empowered by the Board of Directors to level fines. This is not a pleasant process for either the homeowner or the ACC. If you believe that you have a valid excuse for missing an ACC deadline, e-mail the ACC via Sybil Kailihiwa (the WC III manager) skailihiwa@hgmanage.com with a clarification. For example, some owners missed the painting deadline due to their painter being booked out 60 days. The best practice is to let the ACC know that you are going to miss a deadline and request an extension, which is usually granted. This will avoid the leveling of fines.

Doing remodeling and need a dumpster? Send a request to the ACC so that a suitable place and time frame can be arranged. Also, the ACC is reluctant to authorize a Porta-potty but not totally adverse. With good cause.

LifeTime is a full fitness center. You must have a membership and pay extra to include tennis. You have access to drills, lessons, kid's programing and you can reserve a permanent court time. Court fees apply. For all ages and abilities.

Colorado Athletic Club Inverness (or Monaco) is another full fitness center, membership is required but tennis is included. You will be able to find lessons, drills, and kid's programs, as well as reserve permanent court time at these facilities. Court fees apply. Welcoming all ages and abilities.

Club Greenwood offers a "tennis only" membership and no extra court fees. There are seven indoor clay courts at this facility with all the same options as listed above except no permanent court time. All ages and abilities.

Randy Ross Tennis Center Dove Valley is a brand-new premier tennis facility with six beautiful indoor courts. There is a one-time initiation fee and

several types of memberships available (some as low as \$25 per month). This facility offers lessons, leagues, drills and instructional training for all ages and abilities as well as permanent court times. Court fees apply. You really should check it out.

You can also enjoy our crazy Colorado weather and often be able to play outdoors throughout the winter. As a reminder if you are a WC HOA 1 resident you may play on the Jamison or Quebec courts, HOA 2 residents may play on the Mineral courts, or the Willow Way courts, and HOA 3 residents have the five courts at Phillips, which by the way will begin post tension reconstruction at the beginning of this month.

So I began visiting the luxury 55+ and senior communities that were sprouting up everywhere. My, they are impressive! In the common areas, furnishings are reminiscent of genteel parlors from the 1940s and the apartments are well-appointed. You can keep very busy with all the activities on the calendar: from Bingo to theater trips to pickleball (what the heck is pickleball?). And then there was the friendly staff, ready to meet your every need. What more could anyone ask? But still – none of these lovely places felt like home.

After a lot of soul searching, I realized what was missing: purpose! I know I will be needing extra help as I age, but I also want to be helping others. So I might be able to help a young person with their budget or help them start a micro business, and in exchange, a younger resident might be willing to carry in my groceries for me. In short, this is designed to be a community of good neighbors. I can't wait to move in!



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
