Letter from the Board

Greetings, Willow Creek 3 members.

Homeowner Forum – Inquiry about ACC. In November the Board took action to suspend the activities of the existing board so that the policy book can be updated, our management team at HG are filling in the temporary role of the ACC. The board hopes to approve the updated policy book at next month's meeting which will then be published and sent to all homeowners. The board will also appoint a chairperson to the ACC and board members as stated in the covenants in the month of February.

A homeowner mentioned that the City fence has been fixed. Thank you!

A homeowner said thanks to Sybil for being responsive about the snow removal. Has some concerns about the basic quality. Snow guys missed entire townhome rows, so they did some of the rows, and it took 2 extra days to do it all. Sybil did have Brightview come out a couple more times to finish.

A new town homeowner inquired about where his responsibility starts for snow removal and if the heaving sidewalks will be fixed. Responsibility extends to one foot from the door – snow guys go to the stoop a foot from the door. The sidewalk heaving – there are vendors grinding sidewalks. Also, drainage pan behind my garage cracked and sunk so there is a 3 inch gap now, so difficult to get into the garage. Yes, there are 2 alleyways that are on the list to be milled and the concrete re-done. We tried to get these done but vendors could not get it done before the winter set in.

ACC – HG mentioned that we're in the process of revamping the handbook and guidelines for the ACC. Hopefully in the next 2 weeks.

Website: HG has taken over the website. www.willowcreek3.com and things are changing almost every day on it.

Clubhouse. Going to schedule a deep clean now that the heavy season of meetings/parties is done for Dec. So, the deep clean is more expensive \$500+. That includes washing the carpets, kitchen, bathroom. We will re-evaluate the rental costs. Sybil has checked the light cleanings as well as community. Other HOAs properties charge on average \$110 per rental that covers wear and tear, and electricity and water usage. This will be done every 6 months.

All the clubhouse exterior and interior repairs and painting have been addressed.

Sidewalk shaving started Jan 12 and will take about 10 days total. Will send out the sidewalk map out to the community via email blast and website.

Card reader system. Aidan and Sybil will evaluate. This covers the clubhouse, pool, tennis court.

Lights on the pathways have been repaired. Yay. The Christmas lights that wrap the townhome pathways are a nice touch and all board members agreed that this tradition should be continued. It was also mentioned that WC2 had a Christmas tree lighting event that was very nice and a great community event and possibly a similar idea could be done at our clubhouse...more to come.

Violations. We pulled 68 violations, mainly trashcans left out too late, and some parking issues.

There were no bid proposals this month.

Paver Project. Sybil was asked to get the ball rolling on this, there is a concern with supplies all across the board so the board wants to get ahead of any supply issues and plan for getting it done as quickly as possible.

2022 Projects:

- Alley milling and paving will wait until spring as weather permits.
- County Line Fence has been repaired by the city.
- Tennis court the basketball hoops were delivered.
- Pool Contract runs through end of summer 2022.

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

As you may have imagined, we are receiving a lot of questions about wildfire with Boulder's suburban conflagration and its historical hurricane force winds. We often talk about mitigation, but there are also often overlooked steps to prepare for ANY emergency. Below are some often overlooked disaster preparation steps. **Some often forgotten important steps:**

- Reverse 911 Emergency Notification: Many do not realize that your phones have to be opted into the notification system. https://ace911.colorado.gov/arapalert
- Two Ways Out: You don't just need 2 ways out of your home. You also need 2 ways out of your neighborhood. Many times, people are not aware of secondary routes.
- Do you have a go-bag of essentials ready?
- Have you walked your home with your video camera to document what is inside your home for insurance?
- Do you have duplicate copies of important papers at a secondary trusted location?

- Discuss with Children: Additionally, if you were away and your non-driving children were home, would they know what to do if they received an evacuation notification?
