Letter from the Board

Happy New Year, Willow Creek 3 members.

Trash and Recycling: By now, everyone is getting accustomed to Friday being Trash Day, with every other Friday being both Trash and Recycle Day. And that the trash trucks can actually show up at 7:00am! You have also noticed that the trash company will accept an additional yard bag or trash can; no, not 2 or 3 or 4, ... just 1. Some folks complained that the cans were too big to fit in their garages, and HG has contacted Waste Connections about it and the trash company won't issue small cans. You can purchase or use a smaller can – they will pick it up.

Architectural Control Committee (ACC): We have temporarily suspended the committee while the board reviews the ACC policies and procedures. No, this is not a free-for-all; the rules are still in place and inspections are being conducted by the management company. You'll need to re-paint those pink or polkadot painting schemes! And you will need to paint your house if it really needs it. Rule of thumb – almost all exterior repairs, replacements or additions need to be approved by the Association before the work is done. Go to the www.willowcreek3.com website and complete the ACC form. Fines will occur for anyone that does not have prior approval.

Willow Creek Tennis League Memorandum of Understanding (MOU): The WC3 addendum has been approved for the league to use 2 courts for league play. The League includes all 3 Willow Creek HOA teams. The MOU/addendum will need to be renewed by December (annually, much like any other contract).

Tennis Courts: The concrete has been poured, and fence posts installed. The fence will be constructed during the winter once all the material has come in. We must wait till the spring when it will be warm enough to install the coating and paint the lines. There will be 2 courts for tennis, 2 courts for tennis and pickleball (overlaid), and 1 court for basketball and other games.

Alley Milling and Paving: Work started on Monday December 6. Unfortunately, we did not get all the re-paving done on the townhome private streets that we wanted to get done. We will have to wait until spring, when the weather is warm enough, to get more paving done.

Sidewalk grinding: The board approved grinding the raised sidewalk tripping hazards. This work will be started in the next few weeks (weather pending).

Lights on the Pathways: HG Management changed out all light bulbs and had several non-functioning poles repaired. Please call HG if you see a light is out or that has been knocked down.

Fencing Down Along County Line Road: This is in the process of being repaired by City of Centennial (the City owns that part of the fence).

Tree removal/trimming: The Board approved the bid to remove the remaining dead trees that were reviewed by the arborist at the last meeting. The work will be scheduled and communication will be sent out to the homeowners to advise of the dates. This is the work to be done:

Audit: The 2020 audit of the financials has been completed. An audit is a review and inspection of the Association's financials accounts done by an independent accountant to assure HG Management and the Association are following the documented system of recording transactions and the accuracy of financials statements. The board voted to accept the final audit.

Budget: The Board adjusted some budget amounts, but the dues remain the same: \$107 per month for single family homeowners and \$153 for townhome owners. The Approved 2022 Budget will be shown separately. See page 4 of this newsletter. A mailed copy and an email communication has also been sent out to the homeowners.


