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Letter from the Board

Greetings, Willow Creek 3 members,

The HOA Board and the community had a robust meeting on July 14th. As always, we encourage residents to attend these meetings, but for those unable to participate the following provides summary of many of the topics of discussion.

Landscaping: JBK advised they have completed pruning fallen branch removal. Turf spraying will begin shortly. Also, tire tracks the residents have noticed are due to warm/dry weather and should go away naturally. The board requested grass replacement in an area damaged by a re-placed pipe.

Pool: The vendor, Perfect Pools, was in attendance. Pool chemical levels are good, and supplies will likely last through the remainder of the pool season. Additionally, all filters are appropriately sized and operational. A recommendation for valve maintenance in the off-season was provided. The pool 'robot' has not been used in several years, and the board will consider re-placing this optional unit next season. A broken skimmer basket has temporarily been patched with a cover of the wrong size. The correct size is on backorder and will be installed when received. The pool gate lock is scheduled to be replaced, but the gate also needs repair.

The board and vendor discussed the status of the baby pool. An overhanging tree is causing additional debris in the pool. This tree is on the list of landscaping items to address. This pool has a lining with a non-slip surface coating, and this lining has a slightly brown tint to it.

Pool cleanliness was discussed. The lifeguards are tasked with cleaning, but their priority is maintaining a safe pool area. Staffing is a challenge that will need to be addressed for the next pool season.

Lastly, the Community and Grounds committee has been working on a comprehensive plan for improving the pool area.

Social Committee: Fiona stepped down from the committee. Thank you, Fiona, for your four years of service! We would like to correct prior reports about the Social Committee organizing a 4th of July party; these were incorrect and the social committee was not working on that. Diane Kohler volunteered as the next head of the Social Committee. **These community events rely on volunteers to be successful, and we encourage all interested residents to volunteer.**

Tennis Courts: The card reader access system is scheduled to arrive in mid-August. Emptying trash cans is in the landscaping contract. We are updating the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for use with the combined Willow Creek tennis clubs.

Other Landscaping subjects: Board will address the townhome retaining wall replacement in September after peak vendor demand has subsided. A quote to improve the median section when you pull into the neighborhood was received. The provided option was considered unacceptable, and we will seek further bids.

Swim Team: Another successful swim season is wrapping up. The board and swim team will work together on expectations for the 2023 season in the coming months.

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

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



Architectural Control Committee (ACC): Please send ACC requests to ACCwillow3@gmail.com.

Website: The website is updated regularly. The site and ACC request form will be updated with the new management company information after they are onboarded.

Homeowner Forum: Management issues and the pending change in management company were discussed. Irrigation, Tree Removal, and Responsiveness have been negatively impacted under the current management group.

Several Clubhouse concerns and recommendations were addressed. The board is committed to reviewing these items to ensure that the clubhouse is fully functional and adequately equipped for resident uses.

Homelessness: There have been reports of homeless individuals at the pool and sleeping in greenbelt areas. Please use caution, particularly when traveling in the greenbelt areas at night.

Fence: A resident is pursuing fence replacement options with the county and will need community support as the County Line fence belongs to the City of Centennial and not the HOA.

Trash & Recycling: As a reminder, according to community bylaws, trash cans need to be stored out of sight when it is not trash day. Our trash vendor, Waste Connections, only stocks 96-gallon containers and cannot accommodate requests for smaller containers. If you set out your own smaller container, Waste Connections will empty it. Remember the contract rule: the trash truck picks up one trash can and one trash bag. Residents may request additional trash cans from Waste Connections, subject to an added delivery charge. Extra trash cans are available for \$4.00 per month, charged to the homeowner.

Townhome Pavers: This project was started in 2010. Our goal is to do five rows this year. Aidan asked HG in January to get the bid to procure materials, which was never acted upon. The ongoing paver project is a priority, along with the alley paving & concrete sidewalk grinding/shaving, when our new management takes over on August 1st.

Financial Report: We recognize the inconvenience of changing payment information for HG and now RowCal. Many residents have reported that checks have gone uncashed by the out-going community manager. As such, delinquencies have increased and we hope to get back to current status with our new community manager.

Financials were reviewed, but not approved. RowCal is working on future financial reports.

Board Election is in November: We encourage all interested individuals to consider running for the board and serving the community.

Reserve Study: The reserve study will be updated. Jerry Grant and Eric Sinclair are beginning this process.

Board Meeting Attendance: In-person attendance will be important in the coming months with the management change. There was a discussion about video participation vs. in-person requirements, and the board members in attendance agreed that Zoom for board members would only be allowed in rare circumstances.

Pool bathrooms: Many residents have noted that the pool bathrooms need to be redone. A resident volunteered to work on a committee for this project, hoping to complete this during the offseason. The board would like to solicit feedback on community goals for this project; thoughts and requests can be provided to: wc3.poolbathroom@gmail.com
