Letter from the Board

Greetings, Willow Creek 3 members,

The Board changed our community manager to improve service. Our new community manager is RowCal. You will notice that you can call the call center to get most things done. Please login to your account and update your email address so that you can receive emails about community events. You can set up your ACH monthly payments by filling out the form and up-loading it to the rowcal.com website. To reserve the clubhouse, email the care-team@rowcal.com (or call) for availability, and then you will need to fill out the form and submit it.

Monthly Dues: We recognize the inconvenience of changing payment information for HG and now RowCal. Many residents have reported that checks have gone uncashed by the outgoing community manager. As such, delinquencies have increased and we hope to get back to current status with our new community manager.

Board Election is in October: Correction from last month: our election is in October, at the October (2nd Thursday) meeting. We erroneously published the wrong month in the August *Willow Works*. We encourage all interested individuals to consider running for the board and serving the community. Please cast your vote for this election. Last October's election failed to get the requisite number of returned ballots which resulted in the board appointing the two candidates.

Colorado Legislation HB22-1137 has changed how Homeowner Associations collect assessments and enforce covenants. We are making changes to these policies to conform with the new law.

Social Committee: Diane Kohler volunteered as the next head of the Social Committee. These community events rely on volunteers to be successful, and we encourage all interested residents to volunteer.

Tennis Courts: The card reader access system is scheduled to arrive in mid-August. We will get the hardware welded onto the gates. We are updating the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for use with the combined Willow Creek tennis clubs.

Landscaping: Board will address the townhome retaining wall replacement in September after peak vendor demand has subsided. We received a quote to improve the median section when you pull into the neighborhood. The provided option was considered unacceptable, and we will seek further bids.

A homeowner requested a "no outlet" sign for East Phillips Place from the city of Centennial. The homeowner also is concerned about street speed mitigation near the playground. For mitigation of noise from C470 and County Line traffic, Dick is putting together a report that he will present to the city council.

A homeowner asked about the damaged Centurylink utility box on Mineral just past E Phillips Circle. Other residents have called Centurylink about this months ago and Centurylink told them that this repair work is in their queue to get done.

Swim Team: The board and the swim team will work together on expectations for the 2023 season in the coming months.

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
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A Note From Your Neighbor...

Wreaths Across America

The Wreaths Across America program was originated in 1992 thru an original gift of wreaths from the Worcester Family to Arlington National Cemetery. The program grew from there and in 2007, 33,000 wreaths were placed at 286 locations; soon after Wreaths Across America became a 501c-3 nonprofit

organization. The program continues to grow with the help of supporting groups all over the country. The COVID-19 pandemic may have slowed things down but even with that 1,700,000 wreaths were placed at over 300 locations in 2020. Sponsorship groups such as the one I support play a part in the success of the growth each year. In 2021 my group sponsored 382 wreaths for placement at Ft. Logan National Cemetery. Nationwide, 2.4 million veterans' wreaths were placed at 3,137 locations.

At Arlington National Cemetery specifically, the program saw 66 tractor trailers deliver over 250,000 veterans' wreaths that were placed by nearly 38,000 volunteers.

I have been a resident of Willow Creek 3 for over 30 years and continue to look at my neighborhood with pride; so many American Flags! Maybe you have received a Patriotic Pinwheel from us in appreciation on Flag Day, just one of the programs we do. Keep up the good work WC3. My VFW Auxiliary is going into our fourth year of participation in this program, we appreciate any support you can give. If you would like to participate on wreath laying day, December 17,2022, you can volunteer thru our website www.WreathsAcross America.org/CO0103P. I guarantee if you do it once your heart will know it and you will want to return in future years. Its time to pay it forward and share in our dream of seeing a Veterans' wreath on every grave at Ft. Logan National Cemetery.





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

Architectural Control Committee (ACC): Please send ACC requests using the phone Application (App) or logging in to your RowCal account. We have 6 members on the committee. We will re-write the policy book, adding items such as xeriscaping, and so forth. In September we will have another walk-around for violations. The ACC meeting will be September 12th @ 6pm at the clubhouse.

Sidewalk along E Phillips Circle: Aidan and Matt walked the sidewalks and marked the tripping hazards for grinding and the areas that need to be replaced.

Townhome Pavers. The goal is to get five rows finished this year starting in November, and to finish the project next year. Aidan asked HG (previous management company) in January to get the bid to procure materials, which was never acted upon.

Alleyways. Re-paving the worst condition private streets (townhome alleyways) is a priority.

Website: The website is updated regularly. The site and ACC request form will be updated with the new management company information.

Clubhouse. The board is committed to ensuring that the clubhouse is fully functional and adequately equipped for resident uses.

HOA Fence along Quebec. We will assess the condition of the HOA-owned fence along Quebec and prioritize when to do repairs.

County Line Fence. A resident is pursuing fence replacement options with the county and will need community support as the County Line fence belongs to the City of Centennial and not the HOA.

Trash & Recycling: As a reminder, according to community bylaws, trash cans need to be stored out of sight when it is not trash day.

Reserve Study: The reserve study will be updated. We are contracting with the vendor for both the General and Townhome Reserve Studies. Jerry Grant and Eric Sinclair are leading this project that will give us information to help us formulate the 2023 budget.

Board Meeting Attendance: In-person attendance for board members will be important in the coming months with the management change. There was a discussion about video participation vs. in-person requirements, and the board members in attendance agreed that Zoom for board members would only be allowed in rare circumstances.

Pool bathrooms: Many residents have noted that the pool bathrooms need to be redone. A resident volunteered to work on a committee for this project, hoping to complete this during the offseason. The board would like to solicit feedback on community goals for this project; thoughts and requests can be provided to: wc3.poolbathroom@gmail.com
