### **Letter from the Board**

The BOD would like to thank and wish our longtime resident and website developer Bob Correll a fond farewell as he and his wife are moving to Missoula, MT. Bob has served our community for many years being on previous boards, maintaining and updating the website and photographing many community events. The best of luck, Bob.

On Nov. 5th our annual budget meeting was held at the clubhouse. The budget committee went over in detail the 2023 expenses and setting the monthly assessments for all homeowners. After 5 hours of crunching the numbers, it was determined that both single family and townhome owners' monthly assessments will increase. Single family homeowners will increase by \$8 per month and townhome owners will increase by \$12 per month. The contributing factor to the increase is our monthly contributions to the reserve fund. Even though we have a healthy reserve fund due in part to not spending much over the past 4 years, the board has committed to completing several necessary projects in 2023. The clubhouse basement bathrooms are in desperate need of updating, we plan on starting this project in January/February completing it before start of the pool season. The fence along Quebec will be replaced along with the brick pillars, these are a few of many projects that will be completed in 2023. Planting of trees throughout the community will also be completed along with replacing some greenbelt sidewalks.

A budget packet explaining the breakdown is being mailed to all homeowners, this information is also available on our website. If anyone needs further clarification, please ask the board in person in our December 8th monthly meeting.

The board would also like to thank the WCTC for their contribution that was presented to the board for the use of our tennis courts. A MOU is currently being drafted with the WCTC, hoping it will be agreed to and signed off on by the January meeting.

Bonnie also asked if the was going to support the WCTC upcoming 2023 season and the use of 2 courts and youth tennis games. The board supports the WCTC but will wait on approval of the MOU before any commitment of court usage.

### ACC:

The ACC committee has begun the process of updating the policy book. They hope to have it completed and presented it to the BOD for approval by the January monthly meeting.

### Website:

Bob Correll notified the board that he will be moving out of the neighborhood and moving to Montana. A homeowner Andrew Feldman expressed interest in maintaining the website. Bob and Andrew will meet in the next few weeks on a handoff. The BOD thanked Bob for his years of service to the community and his development and maintenance on the website.

Landscape representative was not present.

In the business portion of the meeting the September minutes could not be approved as they were not part of the board packet. The board will follow up with the previous board secretary on these minutes.

### October Financials:

The October financials could not be approved as the transition from our previous property management company is still ongoing. Tom with Row Cal said he would work with their accounting department to button up some remaining issues with HG.

### Attorney report:

Nothing to report.

### 2023 Budget:

Jerry Grant presented the budget spreadsheet. It was determined by the committee that met on November 5th the monthly assessments would increase for all homeowners. Single family monthly assessment will \$116 and town home assessments will be \$166. The main reason in the increase to monthly assessments was due to the increased allocation to the reserve fund. The board plans on renovating the bathrooms in the basement of the clubhouse along with the Quebec fence along with more capital improvements. A move was made by Jerry to approve the 2023 budget as presented, it was seconded by Steve, and all were in favor.

### Management report:

No management report was present in the board packet. Tom stated he would follow up and email the board the most recent report.

### **New Business:**

- Board members discussed the board email and how its managed. It was decided that Tom Hobelman would take over in managing it. 2.
- 2. A discussion was had with regards the need of a clubhouse manager. A move was made by Jerry to hire a clubhouse manager. This was second by MaryBeth and all were in favor. It will be published in the Willow Works. Tom will work with the board on a job description and compensation.
- 3. Dick Boevingloh & Steve Lubell asked for the support of the board on their quest to engage with the City of Centennial council men on the replacement of the County Line fence to a permanent sound barrier wall. The board were in full support of this.

### **Old Business:**

- A motion was made to adopt the recent change to our collections policies that was enacted by the state of Colorado, HB2-822-1137.
- Town home lighting was discussed. Tom will get this addressed.

A move was made at 8:20 to adjourn the meeting.

The same rules for forming a team in 2022 will apply for the 2023 season. Willow Creek teams can only add WC HOA residents to their team until January 1, 2023. WC Teams cannot guarantee spots on their teams to non-HOA players even if they played the previous year. On January 1, if a WC team is not at threshold\* and there are at-level players on the Wanna Play list (which consists of Willow Creek residents who want to play), the team must add a player from the Wanna-Play list until the team reaches threshold. Only if there are no at-level players on the Wanna-Play list may the team offer a spot to a non-resident. The same rules apply after January 1 if a new team forms, if a team drops below threshold, or if a team wants to add players. If you want to have your name added to the Wanna Play list please go to: www.willowcreektennisclub.com. Fill out the required information and someone will be in touch.

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

## Christmas Tree Recycling

It is that time of year for some neighbors to have live cut Christmas trees. Please do not throw your Christmas tree away after the holidays as we see some do each year, unfortunately. Every year South Suburban offers residents a free way to recycle those trees into something useful – mulch. Locations include South Suburban's nearby Willow Spring Service Center, 7100 South Holly Street, in Centennial. Residents can drop off their tree seven days a week from sunrise to sunset in Cornerstone's parking lot in the designated enclosure by the front gate. If desired, the mulch is available for pickup for free later in the spring.

All decorations need to be removed from the tree, including lights, ornaments, garland, tinsel and stands. If the tree is wrapped in a plastic bag, it must be removed at drop-off. Flocked or artificial trees and yard refuse will not be accepted. Most trash and waste removal companies do not accept Christmas trees, so residents are encouraged to take advantage of this free program.

This recipe has been made by my family for 50 years or more and is my most-requested Christmas cookie. The original recipe called for finely chopped semi-sweet chocolate and once the semi-sweet mini morsels chips came out, I switched to them. It didn't change the taste or texture and the time saved is worth it. I usually double this recipe.

### INGREDIENTS

- ½ cup butter, softened
- 3 tbsp. brown sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 cup flour, minus 2 tbsp. flour
- ½ cup miniature chocolate chips
- Powdered sugar (for rolling) about 1½ cups

### DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°.
- 2. Mix ingredients in the order listed except for the powdered sugar.
- 3. Roll into balls (about 1 tbsp each).
- 4. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet and bake 15 20 minutes (bottoms should be golden brown).
- 5. Cool COMPLETELY. Roll in powdered sugar. Store in a cool, dry place.
