# ACC SPRING WALK 2024 - end of March, first half of April

Your HOA Board and the ACC want to thank all the homeowners that take exceptional care of their properties. It not only keeps your home values high and that of your neighbors, it adds to the beautiful neighborhood we we are all proud to call Willow Creek III.

This is a reminder that the ACC members do a Spring Walk every year, so if you see duos walking with clipboards, taking photos, having discussions in front of your property, this is done EVERY spring and all houses and townhomes are reviewed for any maintenance that needs attention.

In 2023, because of the effects of the Pandemic, a lot of maintenance was delayed in previous years and many violations letters were sent out. But, the majority of homeowners completed their projects and the neighborhood is looking pretty spiffy.

Please remember that any changes to your property (residence or lot) need to be pre approved by the ACC before work starts to make sure your changes are cohesive with the neighborhood. The ACC has 30 days to approve these requests (which can extend that date if we have incomplete requests, have questions or need clarification). We usually approve projects much faster when we have thorough requests.

IF you receive a violation letter, it is STRONGLY worded. The wording was selected by the Colorado Legislature and WC3 cannot change that verbiage. It states you have 30 days to correct the issue (which ALSO means you have 30 days to ACKNOWLEDGE the issue). The best response to a violation letter is to contact RowCal through their online website (when possible) and RESPOND to the violation (getting bids, will complete by X, etc). When you acknowledge the violation, you have time to get the work done and you will not be fined. Violations with no response after 30 days will start receiving fines so please respond to avoid additional violation letters and multiple fines.

If you have a paint violation the rules are based on single family home vs. townhome.

Single Family Home - Details on paint colors and approval procedures are on the WC3 website. You MUST first contact the paint coordinator at willowcreek3paint@gmail.com. The Single Family Home paint request form is available on the website for you to fill out and attach to that initial email so we know what colors you would like approved.

Townhome - Go to the Sherwin Williams store, 7580 Park Meadows Dr, Lone Tree and give them your address. Based on the location of your townhome, they will provide you with the appropriate colors (they have a WC3 townhome binder with our specific formulas programmed into their computer). A complete list of colors is also available on the WC3 website. You must fill out an ACC request to paint your townhouse, stating the colors you will be using so we know you have selected the correct colors for your row. RowCal will approve your request.

All homes/townhomes have 6 months to complete your paint project once you are approved. Partial painting is NOT allowed, you must paint your entire residence and garage, including trim.

Another reminder that the Policies that WC3 follows were updated last year and are available on the WC3 website. If you have not read thru these it is strongly suggested you do so, many policies were updated and new ones added.

### Violation fine change - EFFECTIVE January 1, 2024

The way we calculate fines for violations for large maintenance items (painting and fencing) is changing. Fines we are allowed to charge will be assessed over a 3 month period rather than a year for non compliance.

- House/townhouse paint or fence violation, no response after 30 days = \$50 fine
- House/townhouse paint or fence violation, no response additional 30 days = \$150 fine
- House/townhouse paint or fence violation, no response additional 30 days = \$300 fine
- All other violations, no response \$50.

Fines will not accelerate but will continue to be charged at 30 day intervals until the violation is cured. As always, if you receive a violation, please communicate with RowCal so we know you are working on the issue to avoid fines.

In 2024 you have 6 months to paint your house or townhouse. Townhouses require an Architectural Control Committee Request Form be submitted to make sure you have the correct color paint for your row. Single family homes require a Single Family Home Paint Request Form be filled out and sent to the Paint Coordinator to get your colors approved.

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## Emergency Notification Alerts

**How Emergency Alerts Work:** When the county issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern, messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices (land line, mobile, email, instant messaging, text messaging, PDA, alpha or numeric pager, etc.) that you have registered in the system. The system will continue trying to contact you on these devices until it receives a confirmation from you that the message has been received.

Please note that this system will not be used for weather alerts because the timeliness or accuracy of such alerts cannot be guaranteed. There are a variety of other media outlets (TV and radio stations, and weather-related websites and alerts) that can provide this service in a more timely manner.

**How to Sign Up for Emergency Alerts:** Residents and businesses with land line phones are already listed in Arapahoe County's 9-1-1 database, and are therefore automatically included in the notification system. You may sign up to register additional mobile devices here: <https://ace911.colorado.gov/arapalert>. Your information will be kept strictly confidential.

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## Natural Neighbors: Bald Eagle

- February is a good time to spot Bald Eagles as northern lakes are frozen so many eagles are attracted by our open water reservoirs, such as Chatfield and Cherry Creek.
- Only three Bald Eagle nests were found in Colorado in the 1970's, but banning the pesticide DDT and creating forested habitat with water has increased nesting sites to over 200.
- They like to hunt for fish, but will also eat small mammals and birds.
- Colorado Parks and Wildlife is currently conducting a 4-yr study as to why the birds are flourishing in Colorado's urban areas.

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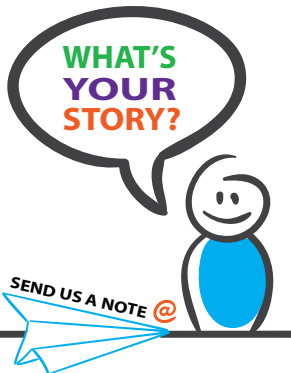
