



Requesting ACC Approval For Your Projects

The ACC is looking forward to projects you might have for 2025. In order to quickly approve your request, please include DETAILS for your project. For example:

- **Fences** please include wood material, size of pickets, location of gate and height of fence. If stain is being used, please include a color sample. For single family homes please be specific on how many sides of your fence you are replacing.
- **Driveways** please include the size of the driveway. Is it the same as the current driveway or are you enlarging (if enlarging, we need dimensions). If you are doing a stamped driveway or color other than natural concrete or brick/rock edging, please include this information.
- Roofs please include the manufacturer, name of shingle and color sample. Townhomes have a specific brand/color of shingle which is required. All roofs must be approved before install. You are also required to paint all roof vents the color of the new shingles.
- **Solar** please include plans and specific location for your solar. Solar panels must fit flat on the roof and all conduit must be painted to match the shingles, trim or siding as applicable. This includes all power boxes mounted on the side of your house that are visible.
- Landscaping please provide detailed plans for grass/hardscape/plants/trees.
- Windows please provide details on manufacturer, style of window, exterior frame color, grids. Townhomes have specific rules, please refer
 to HOA policies on the website.

For HOA policies, please go to our webpage willowcreek3.com, select Architectural Guidelines, Architectural Control Information, Policy Handbook.

The ACC form for approval for projects or painting your townhouse is:

This form must be filled out in detail (with attachments as applicable) and submitted on your RowCal Homeowner page at rowcal.com.

Who Is Cupid?

But the Roman God Cupid has his roots in Greek mythology as the Greek god of love, Eros. Accounts of his birth vary; some say he is the son of Nyx and Erebus; others, of Aphrodite and Ares; still others suggest he is the son of Iris and Zephyrus or even Aphrodite and Zeus (who would have been both his father and grandfather).

According to the Greek Archaic poets, Eros was a handsome immortal who played with the emotions of Gods and men, using golden arrows to incite love and leaden ones to sow aversion. It wasn't until the Hellenistic period that he began to be portrayed as the mischievous, chubby child he'd become on Valentine's Day cards.

Emergency Notification Alerts

How Emergency Alerts Work: When the county issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern, messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices (land line, mobile, email, instant messaging, text messaging, PDA, alpha or numeric pager, etc.) that you have registered in the system. The system will continue trying to contact you on these devices until it receives a confirmation from you that the message has been received.

Please note that this system will not be used for weather alerts because the timeliness or accuracy of such alerts cannot be guaranteed. There are a variety of other media outlets (TV and radio stations, and weather-related websites and alerts) that can provide this service in a more timely manner.

How to Sign Up for Emergency Alerts: Residents and businesses with land line phones are already listed in Arapahoe County's 9-1-1 database, and are therefore automatically included in the notification system. You may sign up to register additional mobile devices here: https://ace911.colorado.gov/arapalert. Your information will be kept strictly confidential.

This is such a great resource for Centennial residents and YMCA members. Be sure to visit our website and see the many activities and mark your calendar for a visit.



No Parking in the Townhouse Alleyways

The townhouse alleyways are not for parking. Please do not park any vehicle or have any contractor park their vehicle in the alleyways at any time. The only exception is for short term loading and unloading.



Willow Creek Pets

Dogs must be leashed when they are out and about in our community. Both the city and our HOA require it. City of Centennial Animal Control patrols Willow Creek and will issue warnings and tickets to offenders. There have been serious incidents in the past where unleashed dogs have injured other pets and/or caused residents to be concerned for their safety.

Don't forget to clean up after your pet when dog walking. The city of Centennial (municipal code 7-7-320) as well as Willow Creek 3 policies, require that pet owners remove and dispose of pet waste on any property other than that of the owner or keeper. In other words, when you are out and about with your dog, don't leave a mess. City fines start at \$50 and can include a Municipal Court appearance. And if you see someone not following the rules, please let them know. Also, both Willow Creek 3 and the city require that dogs be leashed and under control when out in the community.

Did you know?

- 1. Stormwater carries pet waste and other pollutants directly into waterways.
- 2. Animal waste adds nitrogen to the water. Excess nitrogen depletes the oxygen in water necessary for beneficial underwater grasses, wildlife and fish.
- 3. Animal waste may contain harmful organisms such as Giardia, Salmonella and E. coli that can be transmitted to humans and other animals by ingesting contaminated water.
- 4. Roundworms and hookworms deposited by infected animals can live in the soil for long periods of time and be transmitted to other animals and humans.
